

Regulations for the Scandinavian Klubsieger



The goal of the event is to have one main event for all the scandinavian rottweiler-people to get closer. But also to be a bigger attraction for more people to join, and also get a stronger voice in the international rottweiler society.

1 Execution of the event

1.1 Time and place of execution

The Event will take place in May/June every year (simultaneously as the Scandinavian IPO Championship), but is not to interfere with any of the other Scandinavian Events.

The Event should be held at a location that is of such distance and accessibility, that it is appealing for members of the other Union countries to attend.

1.2 Which country to execute

The Event is to cycle between the Scandinavian (hereunder including Finland) Countries, giving each country a 4 year interval.

1.3 Regulation of execution

The Event is to be held in terms of each representative countrys National Kennel Club, so it will be an official event, and if the National Kennel Club permits, the Scandinavian Klubsieger should be a CAC-Event, and with official titles in some form.

1.4 Classes

In addition to the standard classes according to the National Kennel Clubs, puppy-classes (4-6 months, and 6-9 months) will be open for entries. Progeny puppy and Breeder puppy is also a class, for the fun of showing, that are going to be available for entries. These are the same as the PRogeny- and Breeders class, but with puppies.

2 Entries

2.1 Approved Entries

All that meets the requierments of the representative National Kennel Club, and National Breed Club, is ligt to enter and attend the Event.

2.2 Disqualifications and withdraws

In addition to pt 2.1, a dog can be withdrawn from the show by a veterenarian at any point of the Event.

2.3 Handlers responsibilities

Every owner or/and handler is responsible for that their dogs health and best interests are always taken care of, throughout the Event.

3 Judges

3.1 Official classes

Minimum one ADRK judge.

In addition, one more should be non-scandinavian (or Finnish).

3.2 Unofficial classes

Puppies, and the puppy-related classes can be judged by a national judge – or a national experienced person. (Non-licensed, but acknowledged as a respectable rottweiler-breeder)

3.3 Extra judges

If in need of extra judge, he or she should preferably be from outside Scandinavia (including Finland), but allowed.

4 Titles and trophies

4.1 Titles

- The best dog and bitch of the following classes:
Open – Working – Champion is awarded the title *Scandinavian Klubsieger and Klubsiegerin 20XX*
- Junior – Intermedia is awarded the title *Scandinavian Youth Sieger and Siegerin 20XX*
- Veteran is awarded the title *Scandinavian Veteran Sieger and Siegerin 20XX*
- Puppy 4-6 – Puppy 6-9 is awarded the title *Scandinavian Puppy Sieger and Siegerin 20XX*

4.2 Memory Gifts

The judge is to hand out a memory gift to every dog/handler after he or she is finished with the critique.

4.3 Diplomas and critiques

These are to be handed out when the show is finished.

4.4 Trophies

Trophies is to be handed out for all 1st to 4th placements in the classes. Also to all Sieger and Siegerin winners.

In addition the best male and female get one each, and finally the BOB gets one. The trophies should reflect the significance of the show and titles. All trophies are handed out at the end of the show – in a "final-ring" – or "show-off-ring" if possible.

5 Economical aspects

5.1 National representative

Each country is responsible for its own Event. All costs and incomes.

5.2 Entry-fees

The entry-fees should be at such level that as many as possible will attend. That means – as low as possible!

Every country also follows their national discount-systems.

5.3 Winnings

This is to be a non-profit Event, and all potential winnings from the show is to be put back in the next show for the country responsible.
